There were several awards presented by President Walter Ostromecki during this 55th Convention. Ron Blackman received the ANA Presidential Award. This is the Association's 4th highest honor and is given to an individual, organization or club at the sole discretion of the ANA President for meritorious service over many years to both the ANA and numismatic hobby. Walter's selection criteria follows along the lines of recognizing individuals who have worked tirelessly often behind the scenes in numerous capacities.

Gayle Pike and Bill Fivaz received The Numismatic Points of Light Program (NPOL) awards. This is based on a concept developed by US President George H. W. Bush in 1989. That program honored nationally nominated individuals for their long standing commitment and generosity locally within each of the 50 States to community service -- a tradition of neighbor helping neighbor and community that profoundly influences and enhanced the life and spirit of a community. Each shining example has made a difference in the (numismatic hobby) for the betterment and advancement and fun of numismatics. The ANA Board in August 2013 allowed Walter Ostromecki as the 58th President to initiate this award on a 50 state and international country basis with a maximum of 100 of Numismatic Points of Lights being recognized during his two year term. To date 53 have been presented, most to individuals who have never sought the numismatic spotlight, but tirelessly given so much back to future hobbyists freely. This award honors the passionate individual spirit of numismatic service!

We would like also thank our Security Team as they were active in apprehending a person for stealing coins with a notice from a dealer that had attended other shows. Dalton Police was dispatched and the individual was taken to the Dalton Police Department for processing. Also another incident when a dealer notified Security of a person was also committed a theft at the dealer's shop.
